BURBANK – Warner Bros. Studios employees Scott Derek Gaba and Santo C. Ragno have been honored with Time Warner Inc.'s 25th Annual Andrew Heiskell Community Service Awards, which celebrate the exceptional volunteer efforts of the company's employees.

Gaba, Costumer for Warner Bros. Studio Facilities' Corporate Archive Department, co-founded Fresh Start, a sober-living home in Reseda, Calif. Designed to provide a positive place for peer group recovery support and an environment that allows residents to develop individual recovery programs, Fresh Start has grown from a single house for men to a

growing complex that can accommodate up to 18 men and 12 women.

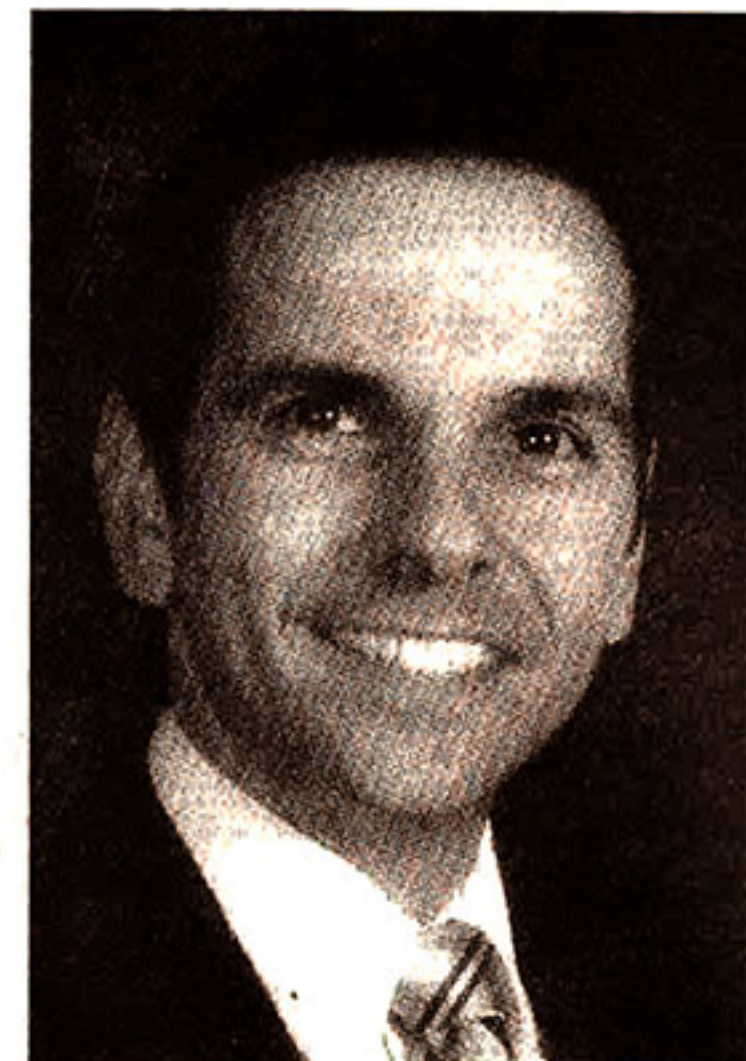
Ragno, Travel Operations Coordinator, Warner Bros. Entertainment, co-founded the Creative Planet School of the Arts, a private nonprofit elementary school in Baldwin Park that offers accelerated academics and an after school arts program to low-income, at-risk youth. The school operates on the belief that all students have the ability to achieve high levels of education when provided with self-esteem, discipline and a positive environment. The Andrew Heiskell Community Service Awards, named for Andrew Heiskell, the late former chairman and CEO of Time Inc., are presented annually to employees of Time Warner who have made exceptional contributions to public service. This year's honorees were nominated by their peers and chosen from among Time Warner's 87,000 employees worldwide.

Each Andrew Heiskell Community Service Award winner receives \$5,000 from Time Warner, in the form of a \$3,000 donation to the nonprofit organization or organizations of his or her choice, and a personal honorarium of \$2,000.
